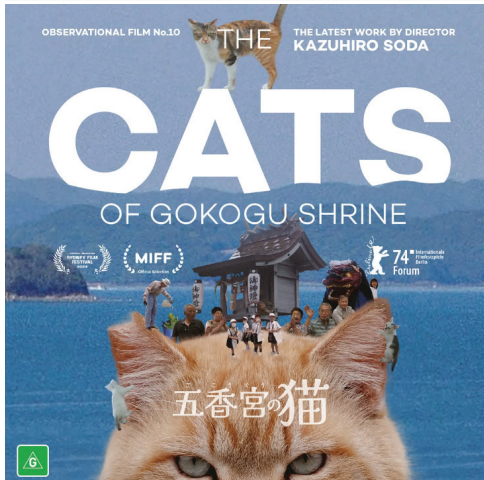
NTL: THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING EARNEST (APR 5)
